WHAT IS A COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG)?

It's a federally funded grant program administered by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), aimed to assist low- to moderate-income neighborhoods in community development projects. CDBG funds can be used for a wide range of projects as long as it involves construction or remodeling.

The CDBG grant is typically around \$100,000, and with the required 1:1 match, the project will total around \$200,000. The project(s) and funding are approved by the Stillwater City Council and administered by the City of Stillwater.
